


Organizational Structure





Semi-staged Opera 8 & 9 April 2022, 8.00pm Victoria Theatre

Our semi-staged opera event featuring Mozart's Così fan tutte serves as a testament to our mission and commitment to nurturing local opera talents and making this art form accessible to a wider audience. The event unfolded over two memorable evenings, on 8 & 9 April 2022, at the prestigious Victoria Theatre, At its core, the event showcased an 80-minute abridged (semi-staged) performance of Mozart's Così fan Tutte, thoughtfully curated to encompass all the musical highlights. Local talents, primarily cast members from our Artists' Training Programme (ATP), brought this production to life, benefiting from comprehensive guidance in language, stagecraft, vocal techniques, and repertoire rehearsals. Outreach Education Engagement: Arts Education Programme in Schools

The National Arts Council-Arts Education Programme (NAC-AEP) in Singapore, established in 1993, has become a cornerstone of the education system, with 95% of MOE schools participating. The 2023-2025 cycle is dedicated to enhancing arts education through the NAC Arts Education Framework, offering four customizable program types.

The Singapore Lyric Opera presents "Laut Singapura – Stories from Our Islands," a program featuring the talents of award-winning composers Lee Jinjun and Terrence Wong, along with writer Sara Florian. This offering includes "A Tale of Three Friends @ Ubin," which delves into the myth of Pulau Ubin's rock formation. The presentation begins with an insightful behind-the-scenes video on opera production and transitions into a performance involving a narrator, singer, and school-friendly instruments, fostering audience interaction.

Another captivating program showcases selections from Engelbert Humperdinck's "Hansel and Gretel" opera, combining storytelling and quintet music. This timeless tale of two children navigating adversity and confronting an evil witch encourages problem-solving and empowerment. Students are immersed in the world of operatic and chamber music, storytelling, and classical music, making for an engaging and educational experience.

None of the Board members is remunerated for his or her Board services in the financial year.



Roles of Sub-Committees Artistic Committee

The Artistic Committee is chaired by Nancy Yuen who is familiar with the approaches and operations of SLO's programmes or services. Depending on its make-up and programmes, this committee's most common responsibilities are:

To oversee new programme development, and monitor existing programmes, so that all programmes are in line with the vision, mission, and objectives of the organization.

To execute, or guide the manifestation of the programmes

To initiate and guide the potentialities of programmes for the future, in particular, developing archives for research and reperformance.



Roles of Sub-Committees Finance Committee

The Finance Committee is responsible for overseeing our funds, financial performance and the annual budget. The committee met four times during the financial year and reviewed the financial performance and annual budget of SLO. The committee also discussed the Reserve Policy, the level of reserves and disclosure in the Annual Report and Finance Report.

Fund-raising Committee

The Fund-raising Committee has oversight of all our fund-raising activities, budget, income and expenses during the financial year. The Committee met four times during the year to discuss fund-raising plans for the next three years.

Nominating Committee

The Nominating Committee is responsible for ensuring that the board of directors is composed of individuals who can effectively govern the organization, make informed decisions, and represent the interests of stakeholders. It plays a critical role in shaping the board's composition, diversity, and overall effectiveness.

Disclosure of Remuneration of three highest paid staff

None of SLO's staff receives more than \$100,000 in annual remuneration each.

SLO has no paid staff, who are close members of the family of Board members or the Manager, who each receives total remuneration of more than \$50,000 during the financial year.



Conflict of Interest Policy

All Board members and staff are required to comply with SLO's conflict of interest policy.

The Board has put in place documented procedures for Board members and staff to declare actual or potential conflicts of interest on a regular and need-to basis.

Board members also abstain and do not participate in decision-making on matters where they have a conflict of interest.

Whistle-Blowing Policy

SLO has in place, a whistle-blowing policy to address concerns about possible wrongdoing or improprieties in financial or other matters within the company.
